after 	Let's play football after school. 
above 	The clock is above the picture. 
below 	Wear the skirt below your knees. 
across 	The dog runs across the road. 
along 	They walk along the beach. 
around 	The earth moves around the sun. 
among 	The house is among the trees. 

Comparisons


We can add '-er' and '-est' to some words.

	-er	-est
 fast	 faster	 fastest
 high	 higher	 highest
 old	 older	 oldest

We use '**...er + than**' to compare two persons or things.

young  Jane is **younger than** Joe.

fast  Sam is **faster than** Tommy.

old  I am **older than** you.

Add s after the verb for **He She It**

No s after the verb for **I You We They**

every Sunday.



She **drinks** milk in
the morning.

We		singing.

You are swimming.



We are diving.



They are singing.



It is flying!



Past Simple

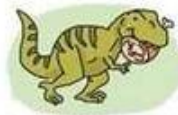
I	played

Dinosaurs **lived** a long time ago.



Some dinosaurs **ate** meat.



Miss Geeta **baked** a lot of cookies.

Present Simple	Present Continuous	Past Simple
every day	now	yesterday
every year	right now	last week
often	today	last month
always		two days ago



Dad reads the news **every day**.



They are singing on the bus **now**.



Ann went to the museum **yesterday**.



Lee had a cold **last week**.
